



Cowrie Crochet Scarf

**Yarn:**

400m of 4ply (fingering weight) yarn. Shown in one hank of Wee County Yarns Hand Dyed Superwash Merino 4ply

The scarf uses all of the yarn and can be adjusted to use smaller or larger amounts.

Notions:

4mm crochet hook

Darning needle

Finished size: Blocked to approx. 2m length and 50cm depth at widest point

Tension: 18 sts per 10cm over [DC, Ch1] pattern after blocking

Chain 6

1: DC in 6th Ch from hook

2: Ch 6 (counts as first DC and Ch1), DC in 6th Ch from hook, ch 1, skip 1 ch, DC in next ch

3: Ch 4 (counts as first DC and Ch1), DC in second DC, Ch 1, DC in ch 4 at end

4: Ch 6, DC in 1st DC from hook, [ch 1, DC in next DC] to end

5: Ch 4, DC in next DC, [ch 1, DC in next DC] to end

Rep rows 4 and 5 until you have 7 holes on the needle. Rep row 4 again. You are increasing on even rows and not increasing on odd rows.

13: Ch 4, DC in next DC, Skip 1 DC, 7 DC in next DC, skip 1 DC, DC in next DC, [ch 1, DC in next DC] to end

14: Ch 6, DC in first DC, [ch1, DC in next DC] twice, Ch3, cluster st in next 7 DC, ch 3, DC in next DC, Ch1, DC in end

15: Ch4, DC in next DC, Ch1, DC in ch3, ch1, DC in cluster st, ch1, DC in ch3, [ch1, DC in next DC] to end

16: as row 4

17: Ch4, DC in next DC, [Ch1, DC in next DC] 3 times, skip 1 DC, 7 DC in next DC, skip 1 DC, DC in next DC, [Ch1, DC in next DC] to end

18: Ch6, DC in first DC, Ch1, DC in next DC, Ch3, cluster st in next 7 DC, Ch3, DC in next DC, [Ch1, DC in next DC] to end

19: Ch 4, DC in next DC, [Ch1, DC in next DC] 3 times, Ch 1, DC in ch3, Ch1, DC in cluster st, Ch1, DC in ch3, [Ch1, DC in next DC] to end

20: as row 4

21: Ch 4, DC in next DC, *Skip 1 DC, 7 DC in next DC, skip 1 DC, DC in next DC, [ch 1, DC in next DC] twice*, Skip 1 DC, 7 DC in next DC, skip 1 DC, DC in next DC

Instructions between * forms row 1 of pattern repeat

22: Ch6, DC in first DC, Ch3, cluster st in next 7 DC, Ch3, {DC in next DC, [ch 1, DC in next DC] twice Ch3, cluster st in next 7 DC, Ch3}, DC in next DC, Ch1, DC in end

Instructions in {brackets} form row 2 of pattern repeat

23: Ch4, DC in next DC, [Ch1, DC in next DC] to end, putting the DC in the Ch3 or cluster st when appropriate

24: as row 4

25: Ch4, DC in next DC, [Ch1, DC in next DC]

three times, {work row 1 of pattern once}, [Ch1, DC in next DC] to end

26: Ch6, DC in first DC, [Ch1, DC in next DC] three times, {work row 2 of pattern once}, [Ch1, DC in next DC] to end

27: as row 23

28: as row 4

29: Ch4, DC in next DC, work row 1 of pattern to end,

30: Ch6, DC in first DC, work row 2 of pattern to end,

31: as row 23

32: as row 4

Rows 25-32 sets pattern. You will not finish at the same point in the pattern on each row, only start a cluster if you have at least four DCs left before the end. Continue to increase as set one DC on every even row. Clusters are started on odd (non-increase) rows and closed on even (increase) rows. Clusters are placed three DCs apart, and alternate between two and five DC from start.

Continue increasing until you have 44 holes (6 clusters), or until half the desired length, or you have used 45% of your yarn (if you want to do the border, if you want to use all your yarn then increase until you have used 50% of your yarn).

Start the decrease section, keeping cluster pattern as set.

On odd rows start Ch4 as before but work until the last DC, do not work DC into the Ch 6 of the row below. On even rows start Ch 6 as before (to give the loopy edge) and work first DC into next DC, not first from hook. Work to end as before.

Continue to work in pattern decreasing one DC on each odd row. Clusters are still started on non-increase rows as before.

Continue until you can no longer fit clusters in, then continue in plain DC/Ch1 stitch until only one hole is left.

Optional border (this can be worked in a contrast colour if desired). Turn work and work into the Ch6 loops. Work 6 SC into each Ch6 loop until both shorter sides are worked. Break yarn, weave in ends and block.

Cluster stitch:

Yo, insert hook in next st, yo, draw yarn through st, yo, draw yarn through two loops on hook, Repeat for next 6 DC, then yo, draw yarn through all loops on hook.

Abbreviations:

St – stitch

Ch – chain

DC- American double crochet (British treble)

SC – American single crochet (British double)
