



Berwick Blooms

Yarn:

10 x JC Rennie Miniballs - 50m/10g in 10 different shades. One miniball will make about 8 motifs. Shown in Cream, Lush, Fairy, Strawberry Sherbet, Carnation, Amethyst, Stonehenge, Confetti, Rosebud and New Lawn and weighs about 65g.

Notions:

3mm crochet hook

Darning needle

Finished size: Blocked to approx. 76"/2m length and 8"/20cm width

Tension: Each motif is roughly 3"/7.5cm diameter after blocking

A light, summery scarf like a bouquet of flowers! You can join the motifs as you go, and it's easy to make a triangular shawl rather than a scarf just by changing the arrangement. The many shades of Miniballs are ideal for this. If you trap the tail of yarn as you do the initial 6DC then you can half the number of ends you need to weave in.

Motif A:

Make slip knot and Ch 2

6 DC (SC in US terminology) in second Ch from hook.

Continuing in spirals not rounds, 2DC in each DC - 12 sts.

[Slip st into next DC, Ch10, Slip st into next DC] x6
You will now have 6 loops of Ch10 to make 6 petals.

[10 DC over Ch10] x6 - go straight from the last DC on one petal to the next DC on the next petal.
[Slip st into DC on first petal] x5 (this brings you to the point of the petal), * [Ch8, Slip st into top DC on next petal] x6, ending in slip st into top of first petal.

Fasten off.

For your subsequent motifs you can join them together as you go as follows:

Motif B: Work as motif A until * . Ch4, slip st into fourth chain of Ch8 on motif A, (B1 on diagram) Ch4, slip st into top DC on next petal, [Ch8, slip st into top DC on next petal] x5. Fasten off.

Motif C: work as motif A until * , Ch4, slip st into

fourth chain of Ch8 on motif B opposite join between motif A and B (C1 on diagram) Ch4, slip st into top DC on next petal, [Ch8, slip st into top DC on next petal] x5. Fasten off.

Motif D: work as motif A until * , Ch4, slip st into last Ch8 of motif B (D1 on diagram), Ch4, slip st into top DC of next petal, Ch4, slip st into last Ch8 of motif A (D2 on diagram), Ch4, slip st into top DC of next petal, [Ch8, slip st into top DC on next petal] x4. Fasten off.

Continue making motifs and joining them in this way as on the diagram below. Working rows of 3 in this way will result in the scarf pictured. There is enough yarn in a miniball 10 pack to make the same length scarf with four in each row. Alternatively they could be arranged in a triangle.

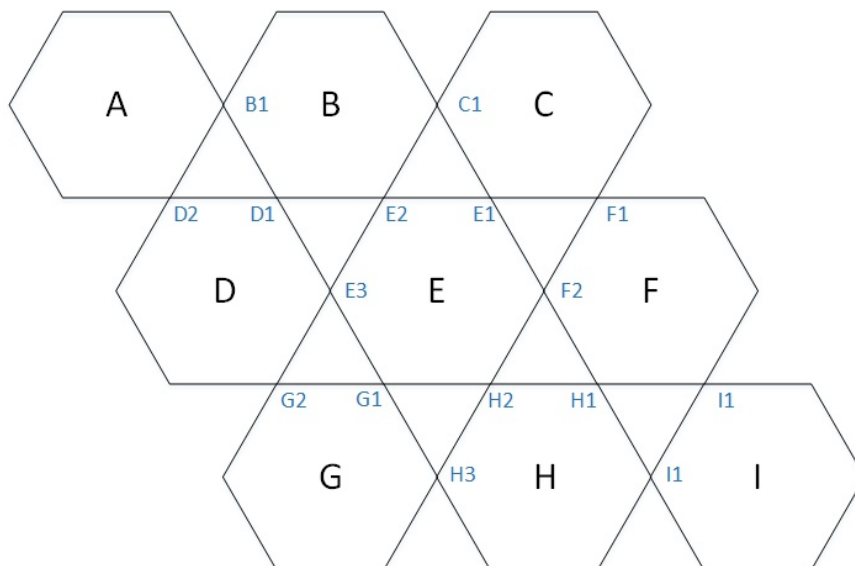
When your scarf is the desired length, weave in ends, wash twice in hot, soapy water (rinsing between washes) and pin out to dry. This yarn softens significantly once washed.

Abbreviations:

Ch - Chain

DC - Double Crochet (single in US terminology)

St - Stitch



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
